
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NAME: Falling Spring District High School SITE #: GB-1389.

Description of Building or Site (Original and Present):

Three-story, flat roof, school building. Red clay tile coping. Stone cornice with brick dentiling and corbeling. Two-story, flat roof wing on north end with metal casement windows. Blonde brick facade with red brick accents on north and south ends; ends also have recessed brick panels. There are five infilled openings on the first floor and they are flanked by one-story, flat roof, projecting, entrance bays with recessed and arched double door entrances. Majority of the upper floor window openings have been infilled and in some cases, smaller modern windows inserted into the openings. Original windows appear to have been wood 6/6, paired with a mullion separating them in each opening. One-story, flat roof hyphen on the south end connects school to two-story, concrete block, arched gymnasium/auditorium. Gym building has metal casement windows. Concrete foundation. 9 bays wide including wing X 3 bays. Art Moderne style.
