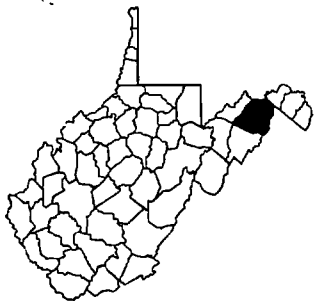


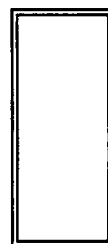

This 2-story, frame, commercial building shares many similarities with its slightly smaller neighbor at 43 West Main Street. Unfortunately these similarities extend to include extensive and unsympathetic alterations. Walls are sheathed with aluminum siding and the 1st, 2nd-story windows are modern replacements. The commercial storefront features a modern, asymmetric reconfiguration. Its windows are large, multi-light, fixed types. The standing-seam, shed roof extends over the front façade in a manner similar to the neighboring building. Despite these unfortunate changes, this building retains sufficient integrity to warrant designation as a contributing resource.
