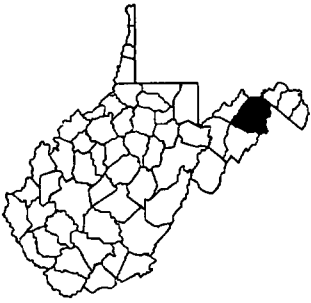

Description of Buildings or Site (Original and Present)

This elegant, gable-front, symmetrical, brick building takes inspiration from both the Greek Revival and, to a lesser extent, Italianate styles. Walls are laid up in 5:1 common bond brick and rest on a granite foundation. Structurally integrated brick pilasters visually divide the exterior walls into bays. Pilasters lack formal capitals, but instead engage the unusual, decorative, brick cornice treatment. Side wall pilasters, however, terminate with more traditional trabeation. The double, front door is either original or historic. The entrance is accented with a 4-light transom and decorative hood. Windows are 12/12 double-hung sash types. The facades two, 1st-story windows are further embellished with a hood that matches the type found about the entrance.

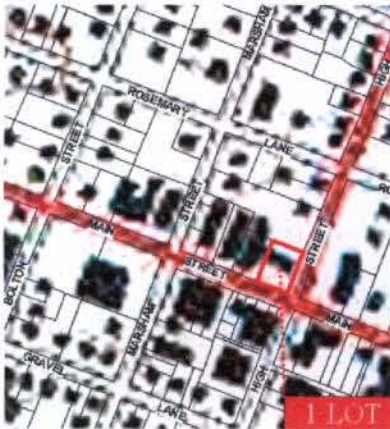

Located at the center of the Historic District, this elegant, 2-story, 3-bay, gable-front, symmetrical, brick building is located at the intersection of Main and High Streets. Its design takes inspiration from both the Greek Revival and, to a lesser degree, Italianate styles. Walls are laid up in 5:1 common bond brick and rest on a granite foundation. Structurally integrated brick pilasters visually divided the exterior walls into bays. Pilasters lack formal capitals, but instead engage the unusual, decorative, brick cornice treatment. Side wall pilasters, however, terminate with more traditional trabeation. The double, front door is either original or historic. The entrance is accented with a 4-light transom and decorative hood. Windows are 12/12 double-hung sash types. The façade's two, 1st-story windows are further embellished with a hood that matches that found above the entrance.
