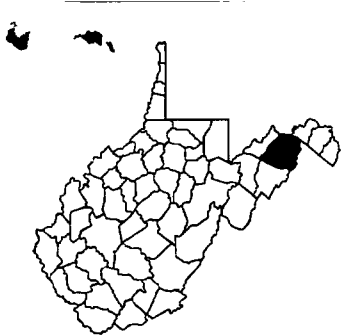

This gable-roofed building features 5:1 common bond brick construction. The original front entrance is enclosed and reduced in size and accommodates a window. Wooden lintels and sills accent facade openings. Windows are modern replacements. Standing seam metal covers the roof. Corbelled bricks serve as cornice treatment on both the front and rear walls. Narrow-gauge fascia boards embellish the roofline of the gable ends. The opening is protected by a hipped-roof porch complete with bracketed capitals. A very long 6:1 common bond brick ell extends from the dwelling's southeast corner. This ell, originally one story in height, was extended to two stories and features a 2nd-story porch. The upper level, possibly a former sleeping porch, has been enclosed and fitted with a continuous bay of windows.

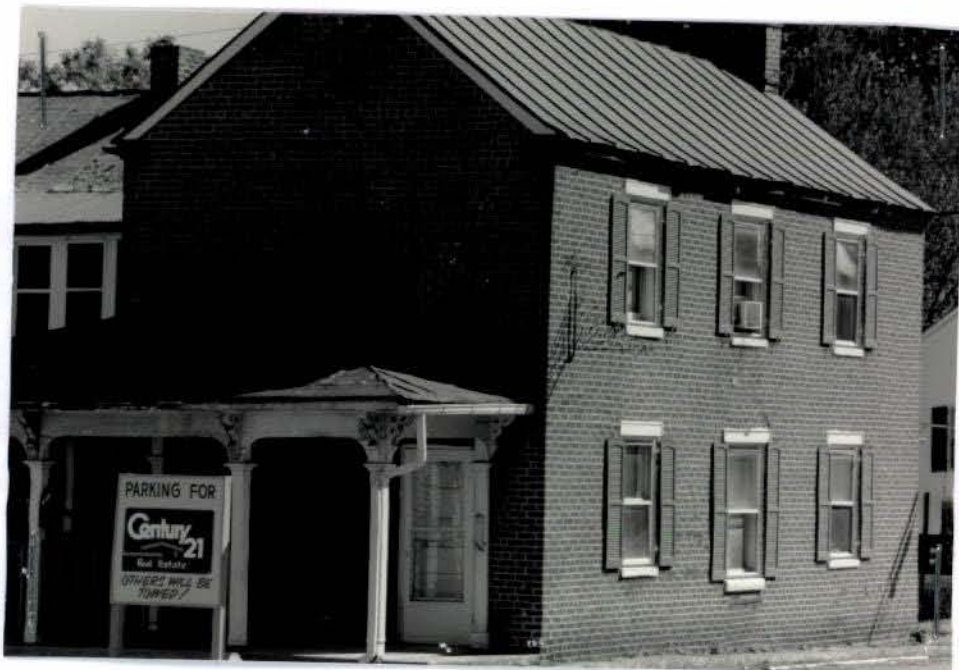
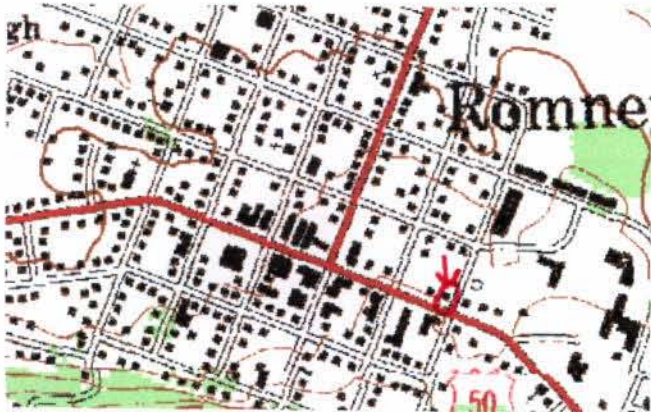

This 2-story, 3-bay, gable-roofed building features 5:1 common bond brick construction. The original front entrance is enclosed and reduced in size and accommodates a window. Wooden lintels and sills accent façade openings. Windows are modern replacements. Standing seam metal covers the roof. Corbelled bricks serve as cornice treatment on both the front and rear walls. Narrow-gauge fascia boards embellish the roofline of the gable ends. Access to the building is through a doorway in the left (west) gable wall. The opening is protected by a hipped-roof porch complete with bracketed capitals. A very long 6:1 common bond brick ell extends from the dwelling's southeast corner. This ell, originally one story in height, was extended to two stories and features a 2nd-story porch. The upper level, possibly a former sleeping porch, has been enclosed and fitted with a continuous bay of windows. This building contributes to the Romney Historic District.
