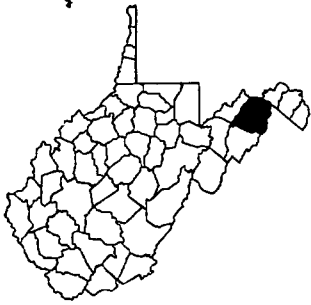


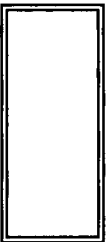

The Romney Post Office is a 1-story, flat-roofed, vaguely International style building. It is setback approximately 60' from the road and fronted by a parking lot and automotive ingress/egress area. Walls are laid up in blond, running bond brick and rest on a slab-on-grade foundation. The entrance is located slightly off center and protected by an aluminum cantilevered canopy. The entry area is distinguished by large plate-glass windows, located immediately left (south) of the aluminum and glass door. The entrance is further accented by the use of red, rather than blond, brick. The Romney Post Office is not considered to be a contributing resource because it is not yet 50 years of age. Unlike the library building, which is considered a contributing resource, the Post Office's significant setback interrupts the traditional rhythm of the street. It is, however, a good and unaltered example of period architecture. Its contribution should be reevaluated when it reaches 50 years of age.
