Front:

Six front bays with old, but not original 2/2 double hung sash. Dutch lapped siding over log construction. Front porch supported by eight square columns joined by later pierced flat railing. Interior walls are exposed logs, stacked porches span the front of the building/.

Massive stone fireplaces three interior chimneys of stone and brick. Building has evolved over the years.

Rear:

Ell wing extension with three ranked bays 2/2 and 3/1 double hung sash. Short wing has shed roof supported by same style columns as the front. Extension has 2 ranked bays and a handicap accessible entry and ramp. Entry sheltered by shed roofed portico. Rear of this wing has one ranked bay and two small attic windows. Third entrance in the corner of the ell. Modern utilities, exterior of the building is frail.
