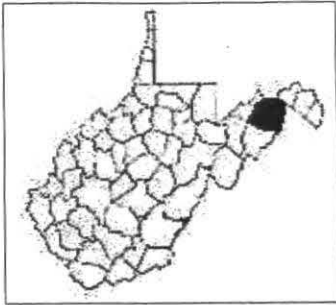

Describe Setting	
This house stands just southwest of the intersection of two county roads in north-central Hampshire County, west of Town Hill in the unincorporated village of Levels.

Description of Buildings or Site (Original and Present)	
1½ Stories 4 Front Bays	
1½-story Craftsman-style Bungalow of wood construction, finished in red insul-brick, with a multiple roof system which incorporates a small gabled dormer on the north elevation and a substantially larger dormer on the façade. Each of the dormers incorporates partial returns of the cornice, and is penetrated by paired windows. The composite roof extends beyond the plane of the building and is supported by clusters of 4 attenuated wood posts which rest on brick piers. Fenestration is flat topped, 3/1.

Statement of Significance:	
The village of Levels was originally known as Levels Cross Roads because of its location at the intersection of four roads in north-central Hampshire County: Bright's Hollow Road (County Route 5/5) north to Okonoko, Little Cacapon-Levels Road (County Route 3/3) southeast to Slanesville, Jersey Mountain Road (County Route 5) south to Romney, and Frenches Station Road (County Route 5/7) northwest to South Branch Depot. This Bungalow has been altered and does not appear to meet National Register Criteria for Evaluation.
