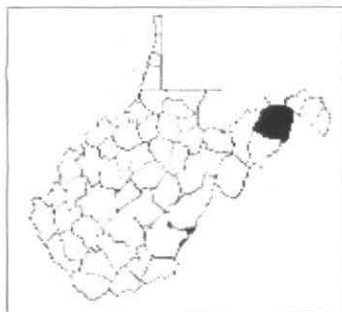
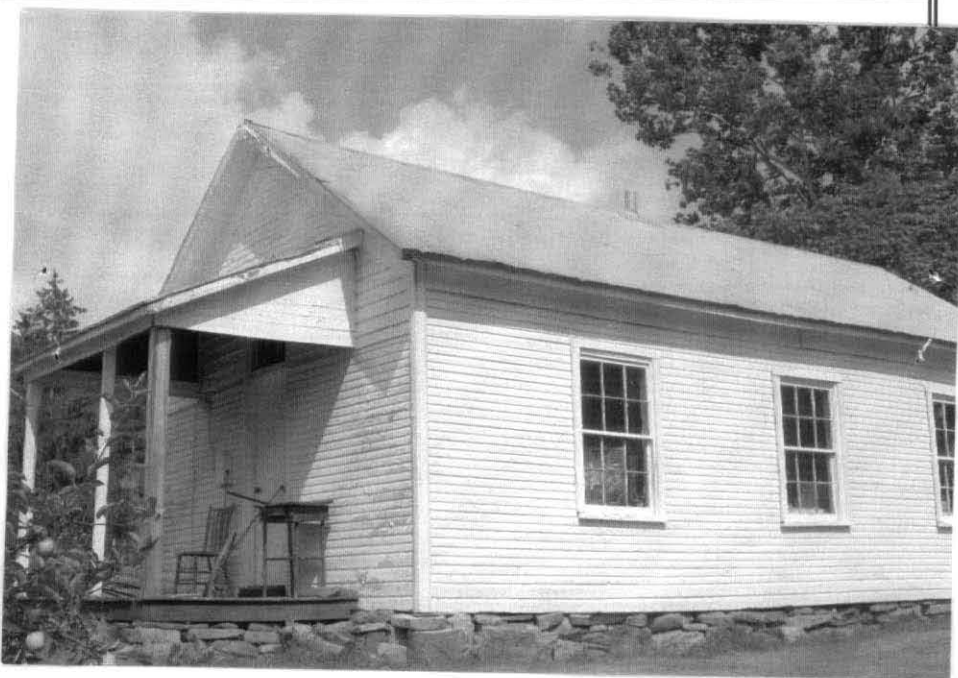

This property lies along a rural county road, in the unincorporated village of Horn Camp, along the eastern foot of South Branch Mountain.

1-story one-room rural schoolhouse finished in shiplap siding, with a gable roof and gable-end orientation, with 3-bay side elevations penetrated by 6/6 flat-topped windows. The 1-bay façade has a centered entrance which is shielded by a shed-roofed porch with replacement, but compatible, wood posts. The interior is intact and finished in wood siding, retaining the original blackboard as well as the original heating stove which was manufactured by the Spence, Baggs & Company of Martin's Ferry, Ohio, and bearing a patent of 1890.

Statement of Significance:	
This is the Horn Camp School, which likely dates from the 1880's, and served until the construction of the Grassy Lick School early in the 20th century (Survey Site 123). This is an extremely well-maintained historic school building, and appears to meet National Register Criteria A for education and C for architecture. This preliminary evaluation would have to be confirmed by the SHPO. The "Wheeling Daily Intelligencer" of September 14, 1885 noted, "Spence, Baggs &
