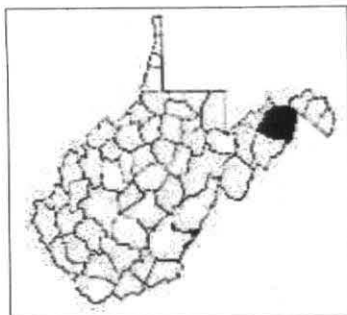

2-story 3-bay central-passage Greek Revival-style residence of brick construction, with a truncated hipped roof which is penetrated by a red brick chimney. Symmetrical 3-bay façade with a hipped-roof portico supported by paired columns and single entry door capped with a transom. Fenestration is flat-topped, 6/6, with replacement sash. The first-story windows are larger than those on the second story. The eaves of house and the porch are trimmed with modillions.

Statement of Significance:

This property is distinctive in this portion of Hampshire County, and represents Greek Revival-style architecture from the mid-19th century. It appears eligible for the National Register under Criterion C for architecture, although its National Register eligibility would have to be confirmed with an inspection of the condition of the interior and with the concurrence of the SHPO.
