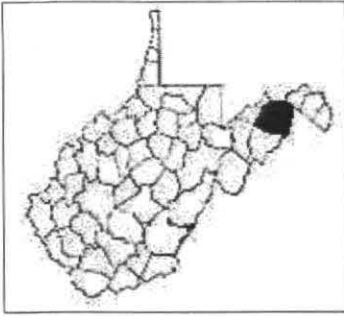

1-story vernacular church building of wood construction, with gable roof and gable-end orientation, with an enclosed pyramidal-roof belfry at the front. A slightly shorter gable-end-oriented portico is on the façade, supported by replacement pillars. Side elevations incorporate flat-top windows with exterior fixed shutters, and a small shed-roof addition has been built onto the south elevation.
