Description of Building or Site (Original and Present) _____ 2 _____ Stories _____ 3 _____ Front Bays The two-story, three-bay, dwelling is clad in weatherboard siding and a cross-gable roof covered in galvanized, lapped-seam metal. Siding under the front cross-gable is laid in an unusual diagonal pattern. Two-over-two double hung wood sash windows are visible throughout. The hipped-roof front porch has been rebuilt using pre-fabricated spindle posts. <i>(Use Continuation Sheets)</i>

Describe All Outbuildings Secondary resources include an end-gable, two-story, outbuilding directly behind dwelling that is clad in wood siding, with galvanized lapped-sheet roofing and 2/2 double-hung wood sash. To the east is a tall gambrel-roof barn with concrete block foundation, vertical wood siding, and asphalt composition shingle roof. Finally also to north to there is a one-story concrete block outbuilding. <i>(Use Continuation Sheets)</i>	
Statement of Significance It is the opinion of the surveyor that this ca. 1870 farm retains sufficient architectural and historical significance and is eligible for inclusion in the National Register. The farm does possess characteristics of demonstrable significance with respect to design, construction and use of materials (Criterion C) as it retains original siding and windows as well the unusual diagonal wood siding under the cross-gable. The farm does not appear to be associated with significant broad patterns, events or persons (Criteria A and B). It has not yielded, nor is it likely to yield, information important to history or prehistory (Criterion D). <i>(Use Continuation Sheets)</i>

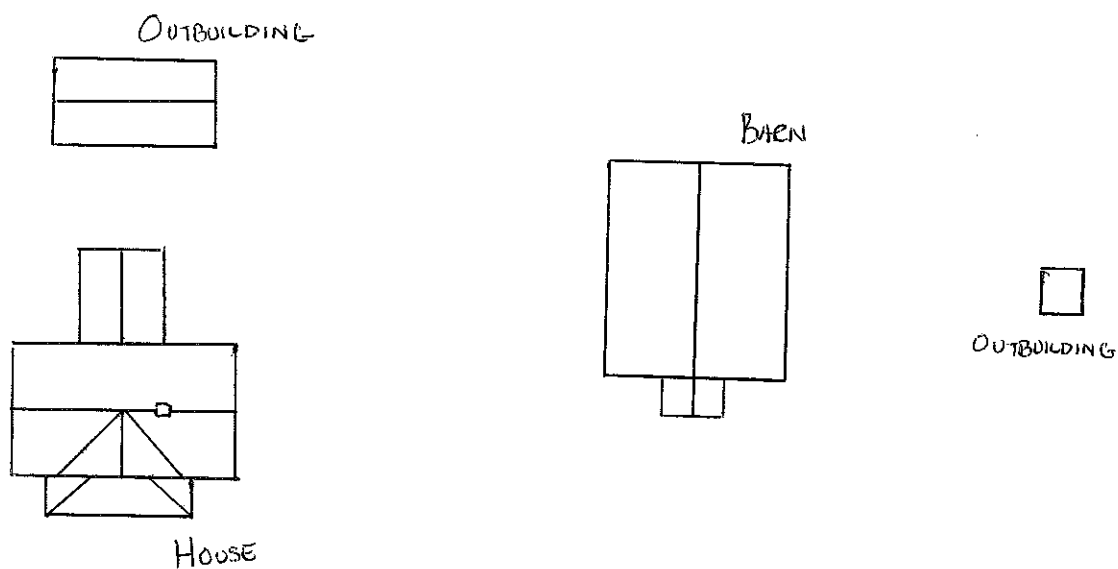
